



A Message from Leadership

Dear Friends,

More than a year into the pandemic, most of us now struggle to summarize in any new way the challenges we all face. Vulnerabilities are everywhere. We all feel the impact – the stress and strain, illness, financial uncertainty, or if we're lucky, just a draining monotony. We know well there's a cavernous need for help, and the Watertown Boys & Girls Club has done much to support the kids in our community. Many have been contending with more than a year of disrupted schools, the time alone at home while parents – some at risk every day - struggle to make ends meet. It seems overwhelming, especially for the kids. In the face of this seemingly unending plague, the Club did what we had to do: rise up for the kids and the community.

Prior to the declaration of COVID-19 as a national emergency in March 2020, the Club was operating at peak performance levels. We were averaging record 200 members a day in our after-school program. Our Watertown Wavemakers Swim Team was preparing to compete in the National Swim Competition in Florida. A successful Biddy Basketball season was winding down. And we hosted what was for many the last big event people joined together as a community at the Club in 2020 for the Great Futures Capital Campaign fundraiser.

Abruptly in mid-March our facility was forced to shut down, in-person programs were put on hold, and fundraising events were canceled, all daunting challenges for our organization.

But when faced with adversity, WBGC stepped up to the challenge in real time and, along with many partners, provided substantial support for the community. We pivoted to offering all our programs and service remotely mid-March and continued that model through the end of the school year. During that time frame, our staff focused on virtual program offerings, tutoring and academic support, and addressing the increasing mental health and food insecurity needs of our members and their families.

Thank you to all of the dedicated Club Sponsors and Supporters who have gotten the Club to where it is today! Your generosity is making a difference in the lives of Club members every day! During the summer months, we continued delivering meals, and conducted regular phone check-ins with our members and their families, connecting them to community resources like rental assistance and social workers. We developed our "Club Academy" to serve as a remote learning site to support our members and families through the hybrid and remote learning models. We also created and managed programs in partnership with Watertown Housing Authority at Willow Park and provided the Watertown Recreation Department a place for community access to programs. And we proudly supported the movement for racial justice. We were so gratified to see our young people to stand up for what is right and use their voices to speak out.

The pandemic scuttled our Spring Auction, a key fundraising event for summer camp, creating a hole in our revenue plan. Through the contributions of many volunteers and staff, we responded with a record performance at the annual Mugar golf event in August. Coupled with increases in corporate, community and personal giving, as well as considerable support from our Board of Directors, we managed to recoup the fundraising revenue and put the Club on excellent financial footing as we continue to navigate the challenge of managing through this unpredictable period.

In short, there were many new needs to address for our members and their families this year, and we were quick to shift our operations to address those needs. Our community partners and supporters responded positively to our plan and vision and helped to ensure we had the resources necessary to provide the expanded services.

2020 was a year like no other! Our community, our nation and our world faced unprecedented challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic. But as Watertown has shown in the past, we are a resilient community and when faced with difficulties, we collectively step up to meet those challenges.
